

Attribution (BY): You must give credit to author(s) or licencensor


Non-Commercial (NC): reuse not for commercial purposes

No Derivatives (ND): work must not be changed


Share Alike (SA): share only with an identical licence





When publishing research data, you have to decide if copyright applies or not, and if so, which are the best options to publish your data as open as possible and as closed as necessary. We will provide guidance on these issues and will specifically explain the meaning of the Creative Commons Public Domain Dedication (CC0).






